SUMMER MATH 5th Grade



xtraMath

xtraMath is a non-profit program that allows students to practice daily math facts for free, all while keeping the child's teacher informed of their progress.

This summer, your child should work on xtraMath 4 days a week for a total of 30 times. Please keep up the login times. My suggestion is to have them do this Monday -Friday (pick 4 days) and take a break on the weekends. After the initial testing is done on the first day (which takes 15-20 minutes), your child will spend no more than 10 minutes a day on xtraMath. I will be following their progress throughout the summer. <u>I will take a grade on 4 random days!</u>

Knowing multiplication facts is VITAI to success in 5th grade math.

Please follow the directions on the xtraMath sheet provided. The directions will get your child logged in and also give you access to their progress.

Did you know that over the course of the 2 month summer break, the typical student loses one month of Spelling skills, 2 months of Math computation skills, and Reading comprehension drops by as much as 6 months? Even more interesting? Research has shown that summer learning loss is accumulating and that it follows a student through middle and high school, as well as, college. Teachers spend the first 4-6 weeks of school re-teaching what was lost over the summer. It is for this reason that NCS has chosen to take a proactive approach to summer work. We are committed to our students and want to provide them with opportunities to "keep the wheels turning" over the summer. With that in mind, we have created summer work that shouldn't be viewed as a burden, but as "daily exercise" for the mind

Your child may read any CHAPTER book of their choosing. The book should be an AR level of at least 4.5. You can find all AR book levels by visiting <u>www.arbookfind.com</u>. There are two requirements with this reading. (I) Students need to complete a diary entry (template and directions included), and (2) Students will need to have a slide in their back to school presentation about their reading. The diary entry will be due when students return to school.
