
A note from Mrs. Lane, Mrs. Robertson, and Miss Fox:


ASSIGNMENTS

Must have at least 14 different words:) The more times you type a word on your list the bigger that the word will be in your final create! The worldle is due in class on the first day of school.

xtraMath is a non-profit program that allows students to practice daily math facts for free, all while keeping the child's teacher informed of their progress.

This summer, your child should work on xtraMath 4 days a week for a total of 30 times. Please keep up the login times. My suggestion is to have them do this Monday - Friday (pick 4 days) and take a break on the weekends. After the initial testing is done on the first day (which takes 15-20 minutes), your child will spend no more than 10 minutes a

day on xtraMath. I will be following their progress throughout the summer. I will take a grade on 4 random days!

Knowing multiplication facts is VITAI to success in 5th grade math.

Please follow the directions on the xtraMath sheet provided. The directions will get your child logged in and also give you access to their progress.
