Did you know that over the course of the 2-month summer break, the typical student loses one month of Spelling skills, 2 months of Math computation skills, and Reading comprehension drops by as much as 6 months? Even more interesting? Research has shown that summer learning loss is accumulating and that it follows a student through middle and high school, as well as, college. Teachers spend the first 4-6 weeks of school re-teaching what was lost over the summer. It is for this reason that NCS has chosen to take a proactive approach to summer work. We are committed to our students and want to provide them with opportunities to "keep the wheels turning" over the summer. With that in mind, we have created summer practice that shouldn't be seen as work, but instead, an opportunity to "exercise your brain". If you present this as an opportunity for your child to "grow their brain" rather than a daily chore, you'll find that most students will easily make it a part of their daily routine.


